Trash and Recycling**

Trash and Recycling

- Please refer to your trash and recycling Quick Reference Guide for do's and don'ts. If you need a new copy, please call Grounds at ext. 5375. It's also available in the Villager Handbook on Uniguest.
- All trash and recycling should be set out by 8:00 am on Mondays, with paper and cardboard bagged with your recyclables. As a reminder, there is **no recycling pickup on Thursdays**. We pick up trash and yard debris on Thursdays. Recycling placed out on Thursdays will not be picked up.
- Cat litter, pet pads and briefs, etc. must be double bagged or in a heavy-duty bag, being considerate of the weight of bags and our staff/volunteers who must load these bags onto the trash truck. 13-gallon trash bags should not weigh more than 10-15 lbs.
- If you're putting things in grocery bags, the grocery bags should then be put in a regular trash bag; especially if it has any weight to it. Dragging bags across your driveway or sidewalk to get them out along the curb, creates tears, and potentially additional cleanup and delays. All bags should be tied very securely (double knotted if you can).
- Hearthside Residents: All trash and recyclables must be bagged before you deposit them into the larger waste cans in the garages. The smaller cans with the step lid are for smaller, loose trash.

The U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and participating local law enforcement agencies are coordinating a nationwide drug "take-back" day on Saturday, April 26 from 10:00 am to 2:00 pm. This one-day event will provide residents with anonymous, no-cost collection of unwanted and expired medicines.

All medications will be disposed of in a safe and environmentally friendly manner.

Important details for disposal:

- Prescription, over-the-counter, and veterinary medications will be accepted.
- Medications should be removed from the containers and placed in a plastic bag.
- No sharps, syringes, needles, or thermometers. The Residential Health Team can provide sharps containers if you need them.
- Pills, liquids, and creams are accepted.

Protect yourself and the environment:

- Do not flush unwanted or leftover medications down the drain. This is not good for the water supply system or streams and rivers.
- Never give your unwanted medicine to someone else or take a prescription that was not prescribed for you.
- Having unwanted medications around the home presents a danger to children, guests and pets.

The closest confirmed drop-off location will be the Loyal Order of the Moose, in McSherrystown, PA. Contact Residential Health at ext. 5387 or ext. 5335 if you need assistance with disposing of your medications or stop by the office to drop off.
