Memorial Day Military Veterans Committee

Monday, May 26, is Memorial Day. The CKV Veterans Committee has placed a display in the Harmony Ridge Lobby to honor all those who gave their lives in defense of the nation.

Memorial Day is a national holiday set aside to honor the country's military members who died in service. It dates to the Civil War but at that time was known as "Decoration Day" because of the tradition of decorating soldiers' graves with flowers and flags. It was extended to include fallen soldiers from all American wars in 1971 when Congress declared it a national holiday, changing the observance from May 30 to the last Monday in May.

In 2000 Congress signed the "National Moment of Remembrance Act" into law. From that point forward, citizens are encouraged to pause for a moment of silence at 3:00 pm local time each Memorial Day.

Flags should be flown at half-staff from sunrise until noon, at which time they should be raised to the top of the staff.

Currently there are about 150 military veterans living at Cross Keys Village. Thank you for being willing to risk all in defense of the United States of America.



Memorial Day Quotes Pastor Linda Titzell, Ext. 5580

The following Memorial Day quotes powerfully capture the spirit of the holiday.

"Heroism is not only in the man, but in the occasion."

— Calvin Coolidge spoke these words in a 1928 address that dedicated a memorial to Colonel William Colvill who served in the Civil War.

"Eternal vigilance is the price of freedom." — Thomas Jefferson. These words are as relevant today as they were then

can never fully repay, but we can honor their sacrifice."

— Barack Obama spoke these words in his 2011

Memorial Day remarks.

"For love of country, they accepted death." — Before he was elected president, retired Union Major General James A. Garfield spoke these words at Arlington Cemetery's first Memorial Day service on May 30, 1868. Preceding this quote were additional powerful lines: "We do not know one promise these men made, one pledge they gave, one word they spoke: but we do know they summed up and perfected, by one supreme act, the highest virtues of men and citizens."

"Each of the patriots whom we remember on this day was first a beloved son or daughter, a brother or sister, or a spouse, friend, and neighbor." — George H. W. Bush delivered this Prayer for Peace on Memorial Day in 1992.

"Let every nation know, whether it wishes us well or ill, that we shall pay any price, bear any burden, meet any hardship, support any friend, oppose any foe to assure the survival and the success of liberty." — John F. Kennedy spoke these words during his 1961 inaugural address.

"I don't have to tell you how fragile this precious gift of freedom is. Every time we hear, watch, or read the news, we are reminded that liberty is a rare commodity in this world." — Ronald Reagan delivered this Memorial Day message on May 26, 1983, adding: "Memorial Day is a time to take stock of the present, reflect on the past, and renew our commitment to the future of America."

"They do not need our praise. They do not need that our admiration should sustain them. There is no immortality that is safer than theirs. We come not for their sakes but for our own, in order that we may drink at the same springs of inspiration from which they themselves drank." —Woodrow Wilson's 1914 Memorial Day address.
