# Pentecost Pastor Linda Titzell, Ext. 5580

Pentecost, also known as the Feast of Weeks, originated in the Old Testament as a harvest festival observed 50 days after the Passover. It commemorated the giving of the Law to Moses at Mount Sinai.

In the early first century, this day became significant when the promised Holy Spirit was poured out on Jesus' followers. This event marks a pivotal moment in the unfolding of salvation history. The prophet Joel foretold a time when God would pour out His Spirit on all people: "And afterward I will pour out My Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters

will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, and your young men will see visions." At Pentecost, this prophecy came to fruition. As the disciples gathered, "Suddenly a sound like a mighty rushing wind came from heaven and filled the whole house... There appeared to them tongues as of fire... And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit...." This manifestation signaled the transition from the Old Covenant to the New Covenant in Christ's redemptive plan. Because so many came to faith through the testimony inspired by the Holy Spirit, Pentecost is widely considered the birthday of the Church.

Just as the Law was given to Moses at Sinai, guiding ancient Israel, the Holy Spirit came to indwell believers, guiding them into all truth and empowering them for ministry. This connection highlights the continuity and unity of Scripture, bridging the Old Covenant context with the New Covenant fulfillment.

One vital aspect of Pentecost is its role in breaking down cultural and linguistic barriers. People from diverse backgrounds became united through their encounter with Christ, fulfilling promises of God's inclusive kingdom. Pentecost demonstrates that salvation is not accomplished by human effort but by divine action. The Holy Spirit's descent reveals the depth of God's redemptive plan to indwell and transform believers. Just as the disciples received the Spirit together, the Church as a whole is called to live and work in the unity of the Spirit. Sunday, June 8 is Pentecost Sunday in the Christian faith.

# RV, Camper, & Trailer Parking

As we look forward to spring and summer activities, this is a reminder for RV, camper, and trailer owners. Villagers may park an RV, camper, or trailer in their driveway or parking spot for up to three consecutive days, provided the vehicle does not impede traffic flow or the vision of others where it is parked. After three days, the vehicle must leave campus and may not be stored in another lot or location on campus. This provides adequate time for Villagers to load or unload their camper or RV for a trip.

CKV does not currently offer long-term storage for RVs, campers, or trailers, and we encourage you to

contact local storage facilities for accommodations. These vehicles must be registered with Residential Living.

In keeping with all CKV guidelines, Villager guests should adhere to the protocols in the RV, Camper, & Trailer guidelines. Harmony Ridge and Hearthside Villagers should contact me if you are expecting an RV guest to make parking arrangements.




