Village News

Village Council Elections Schedule for 2026

Nomination and Election Committee

The Village Council plays an important role in Cross Keys Village and in the daily lives of Villagers. The Council is your voice and your connection to the CKV Leadership. The Village Council election process begins in March, and the timeline is as follows:

No later than March 2 – Distribute Village Council Elections information to all Villagers.

March 9 - On this date, self-nomination ballots will be distributed to all villagers, a description of the duties and responsibilities of a delegate, and a current roster of Village Council Delegates. The ballot is only to be returned if you are nominating yourself to be a Village Council Delegate.

March 16 – Self-nomination ballots are due to be returned to the Harmony Ridge ballot box.

March 23 - Election ballots will be distributed to neighborhoods with more than one self-nomination.

April 6 – Election ballots are due to be returned to Harmony Ridge.

No later than April 24 - Ballots will be counted and election winners will be notified.

May Council Meeting – Delegate-elects are invited to attend and observe the May Village Council meeting.

June Council Meeting – Delegate-elects begin their term as neighborhood delegates.

Dates are subject to change without notice.

Increase Your Income

Somehow it seems that the cost of most everything continuously rises. However, particularly for those on fixed income, folks may not experience an increase in income to keep pace with the increased cost of living. Those who have an IRA account and have or will attain age 73 in 2026 must withdraw a specified amount from their traditional IRA and report that amount as taxable income. However, there is a way to avoid paying tax on some or all of that required distribution while also creating additional income.

The IRS now allows individuals or couples to use funds from their traditional IRA to give the required minimal distribution to a nonprofit for the purpose of creating a charitable gift annuity. The maximum amount that can be used for this purpose is \$55,000 in 2026. The IRS limits this type of gift to only one per person in their lifetime. However, a couple who both have traditional IRAs can combine their RMDs and do a joint gift annuity where both receive income for life.

Here is an example of how this arrangement works. Mr. and Mrs. Smith have traditional IRAs, and each is required to withdraw \$10,000 in 2026. If they are in a 22% tax bracket, they would pay \$4400 in federal income tax on the combined \$20,000 withdrawal. However, if they use the \$20,000 to create a charitable gift annuity, they do not pay any tax on the withdraw and they receive income for the rest of their lives from the annuity.
