In the event of severe weather, a civil disturbance, or other unusual circumstances, you may receive a call and/or text from our automated system with a prerecorded message of what to do and important updates. We will be testing our new system again for all Villagers and team members on Wednesday, March 4.

The message will state that “This is only a test.” Part of this test is to ensure that we are reaching all team members and Villagers. We are still working with the vendor to update the caller ID for the new system. Please make sure to have the number, 224-464-4460, entered into your contacts list. The call originates from Wheeling, IL. Some spam call blocking software may prevent the call from coming through or leaving messages, so entering this number as a recognized contact will help with that. You can title it as “CKV Alert” or something similar to pop up in your contacts list.

Cell phone users should receive a text message. If you do not have a landline phone, then a call should also come through to your cell phone. If you have a landline phone, the call should be received there. If you do not receive the call or text or have difficulties with the message, please contact the Information Services department at ext. 7200 or enter a work order in Uniguest so we can look into your issue.

Brethren Heritage Series **Spotlight: Warren Eshbach** **Holly Fetting, Ext. 5544** **Director of Life Enrichment**

As a community, we are committed to our refocus on spiritual care. From the perspective of life enrichment, we are constantly looking for ways to offer interesting programming across all dimensions, including spiritual wellness.
