Brethren Heritage Series Spotlight: Denise Kettering-Lane Holly Fetting, Ext. 5544 Director of Life Enrichment

As part of our commitment to our refocus on spiritual care, we are excited to partner with Susquehanna Valley Ministry Center to bring another expert in Brethren Studies to our campus for our Brethren Heritage Series. As I mentioned previously, whether you are Brethren or not, this series is for us all!

The second day of the series dives into Love Feast, featuring two unique sessions led by Denise Kettering-Lane on Friday, March 13, in Nicarry Meetinghouse. The morning session, 10:30-11:30 am, will focus on the theological meaning and movements of the Brethren Love Feast tradition over the past 30 years. The afternoon session, 1:30-2:30 pm, will emphasize different practical aspects of Love Feast and demonstrate some practices, such as feet washing.

You might choose to attend because you're interested in learning about religion and history – your own or others'. Maybe you've celebrated Love Feast for years and want to know more, maybe you've heard of Love Feast but don't really know what it is, or maybe you've never even heard of it.

Denise Kettering Lane is an associate professor of Brethren Studies and director of the MA Program at Bethany Theological Seminary in Richmond, Indiana. Denise received a BA in Religion from Ashland University in Ohio, a Master's in Theological Studies from Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Georgia, and a PhD in Religious Studies at the University of Iowa. While

completing her PhD, Denise served as a research fellow at the University of Iowa and the Institute for European History in Mainz, Germany. Denise's doctoral dissertation examined the ways in which the beliefs and practices of the Pietist movement both challenged and reinforced existing gender roles in early modern Germany. Denise has served as an archival assistant at the Brethren Historical Library and Archives and on the Brethren Historical Committee and is the editor for Brethren Life and Thought.

If you want a deeper understanding of the principal practice of the Brethren Church, make plans now to come to these sessions. Sign up in Uniguest or the Harmony Ridge Lobby. We will have a shuttle running a loop from Harmony Ridge Lobby to Nicarry beginning at 9:45 am and running until 3:00 pm. We are writing to share an important update about our organization.

Effective January 1, 2026, Crossing Point Collaborative was established, with Board of Director approval, to be the parent organization of Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community and The Brethren Home Foundation.

Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community will continue to operate as it always has while continuing to honor and preserve its faith-based mission, values and longstanding relationship with the Southern Pennsylvania District Church of the Brethren. This change will not affect your experience as a Resident or Villager and there are no changes to daily life, services, team members, or leadership. The community's name will continue to be Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community.

Crossing Point Collaborative, the new parent organization, will provide governance oversight and shared support to help ensure long-term stability and sustainability for Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community. Crossing Point Collaborative, Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community, and The Brethren Home Foundation will remain nonprofit organizations.

Thank you for your trust and for being such an important part of Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community. An FAQ is attached for your convenience.

Frequently Asked Questions

What is Crossing Point Collaborative?

Effective January 1, 2026, Crossing Point Collaborative was established, with Board of Director approval, as the parent organization of Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community and The Brethren Home Foundation. Crossing Point Collaborative provides governance, strategic oversight, and shared services to support the organization’s long-term mission and sustainability.

Why was Crossing Point Collaborative created?

As the organization grew in size and complexity, it became necessary to evolve the governance structure to support responsible oversight and long-term planning. The formation of Crossing Point Collaborative strengthens governance while preserving the faith-based Mission, Vision, and Values that define Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community. It also serves to protect The Brethren Home Foundation and the Southern Pennsylvania District Church of the Brethren from unintended financial risk.

Does this change affect residents, team members, or services?

No. There is no impact to residents, team members, services, or daily operations.

Is Cross Keys Village still a non-profit organization?

Yes, Crossing Point Collaborative, The Brethren Home Community, and The Brethren Home Foundation were established as non-profit organizations and will remain that way.

Is Cross Keys Village changing its name or brand?

No. Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community will continue to operate under its existing name. Crossing Point Collaborative functions as a parent governance organization and does not represent a change in brand or identity for residents or the public.

What is the relationship to the Southern Pennsylvania District Church of the Brethren following this change?

While legal structures have been realigned to reduce financial exposure, Cross Keys Village – The Brethren Home Community continues to honor and preserve its longstanding faith-based heritage, values, and relationships with the Southern Pennsylvania District Church of the Brethren.

Who governs Crossing Point Collaborative?

Crossing Points Collaborative is governed by a Board of Directors committed to stewardship, accountability, mission alignment, and the continued strength of the organization.

Will there be changes to leadership or management?

No changes have been made to executive leadership or operational management as a result of this governance transition.

Where can I learn more?

Additional information will be shared through leadership communications and the organization’s website. Questions are always welcome.
