Giving to Save Don Wilkinson, Ext 6497 Foundation Office

Many of you are probably giving to favorite charities, and I want to remind you that you will want to get receipts for your gifts since you can deduct those donations on your federal income tax return. Even if you don't itemize deductions on your federal return, in 2026 single filers can deduct up to \$1,000 of charitable donations on your federal return while taking the standard deduction. Married individuals filing a joint return can deduct up to \$2,000.

While we often give to charities via cash, check, or credit card, another method that can be very beneficial for those who own appreciated stock is to donate shares. For example, if a donor wants to donate \$250 to a charity and owns, for example, 200 shares of stock, which they purchased for \$10 per share and are now worth \$25 per share, they can avoid paying capital gains tax on the shares by simply donating 10 shares to the charity. If they had cashed the shares to make the donation, they would have paid capital gains tax on the \$150 of gain. In addition, you can use shares of stock to create a charitable gift annuity and receive lifetime income for one or two beneficiaries.
