When Trauma Changes You (or Someone You Love), Healing Begins Here

Maybe it was a single moment that changed everything. Or maybe it was years of quiet pain that slowly reshaped your sense of self, your faith, or your relationships. You may not think of it as “trauma”, but you recognize that something feels different now. You react more strongly than you used to. Or you shut down when you wish you wouldn’t. Maybe someone you love seems more anxious, withdrawn, or easily overwhelmed, and you’re trying to understand what’s happening beneath the surface. Trauma has a way of lingering — not just in memory, but in the body, in patterns of thought, and sometimes even in the way we relate to God. And yet, what has shaped you does not have to define you. That’s why Focus on the Family created Finding Hope and Healing from Trauma, a free 8-part video series featuring author and licensed Christian counselor Eliza Huie.

With compassion and Scripture-centered sessions, Eliza will help you:

- Understand what trauma is — and how it affects the brain and body
- Take meaningful steps to begin processing

- painful experiences in healthy, practical ways
- Support a loved one walking through trauma with wisdom and compassion
- See how Christ meets you gently in the middle of your story

Each video is designed to give you clarity without overwhelm and guidance without pressure. You can move at your own pace, taking in practical tools and biblical truth that speak to both the emotional and spiritual impact of trauma. To receive

Volunteer Meal Ticket Changes

As of July 1, 2026, the golden-colored volunteer meal tickets will be switching to a hard plastic card. Each card will be numbered and dated. When signing for a meal ticket on the day of completing at least two consecutive operational support volunteer hours, volunteers will now be asked to list not only the date, their name, and the volunteer job for the day but also the number on the meal ticket card sign-up sheet.

We are hoping this new system will save time and printing expenses while we are able to reuse the cards daily. Volunteers should get their meal tickets in the building where they plan to use them.
