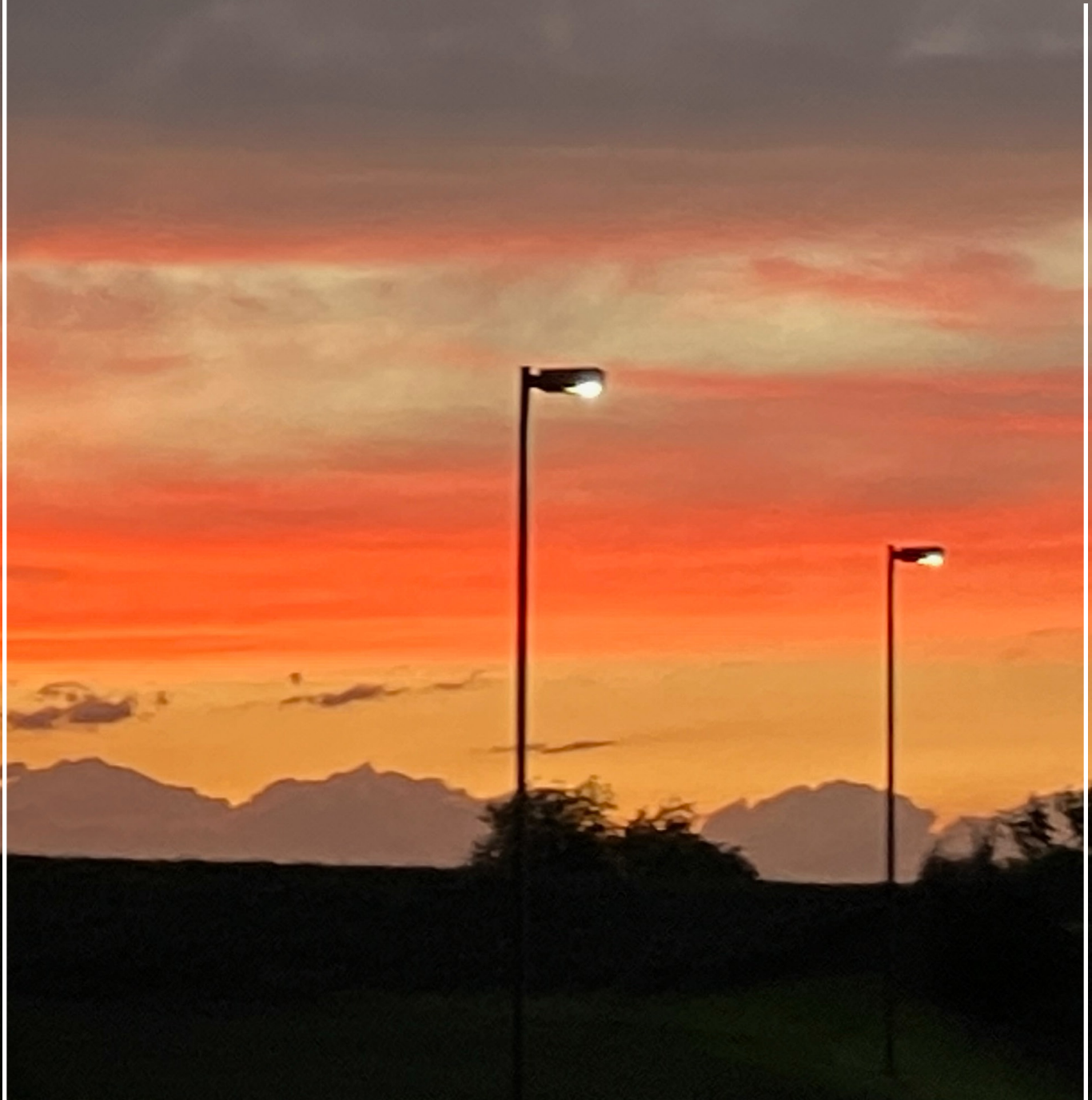

## Coffee & Conversation Corner CKV Executive Team

It was a pleasure to welcome so many Villagers to our first Coffee & Conversation with the executive and operational leadership teams. We sincerely appreciate everyone who attended and shared questions, ideas, and thoughtful feedback. The open dialogue was meaningful, and your input helps us better understand what matters most to our Villagers.

One of the highest-priority topics discussed was campus traffic safety, speeding concerns, missing crosswalk signs, the Horst Road gate delay and the need to communicate traffic safety rules. We have taken these concerns seriously. We have conducted a communication blitz for all team members, vendors, and Villagers with reminders about campus speed limits. We have also replaced and ordered more pedestrian crosswalk signs. The gate at Horst Road has been repaired, and a drivers' safety course will soon be coming to campus.

We also discussed several other areas of focus, including ways to strengthen communication, expand volunteer opportunities, and continue strengthening how we attract, support, and retain team members. Additional topics included enhancing transportation for our veterans, working with local hospitals to help ensure residents have a smoother return to campus, and asking Village

Council to evaluate interest in a dog park on campus.

These gatherings are an opportunity to ask questions, share ideas, hear updates on topics discussed during previous sessions, and connect directly with members of the executive and operational leadership teams.
