The 53-minute documentary "Goin' Back to T-Town" relies on historical documents and first-hand accounts to tell the story of the growth of Oklahoma's Black communities during America's Westward expansion as well as the birth, growth, and prosperity of Tulsa's Black Wall Street. Following Black Wall Street's destruction in 1921, it rose from the ashes, once again prospered, and survived the Great Depression. Ironically, integration, urban renewal, and interstate highway construction achieved what Jim Crow never could: the destruction of Tulsa's Black Wall Street. The government programs, in other words, provide another example of "the best-laid plans of mice and men sometimes go awry."
