CKV Emergency Alert System Test

In the event of severe weather, a civil disturbance, or another emergency, CKV's automated alert system may send you a call and/or text with important information and instructions.

We will test the system again on Tuesday, August 25, around 11:30 am for all Villagers and team members. The message will state, "This is only a test."

The call may appear to come from Wheeling, IL, from phone number 224-464-4460. Please save this number as "CKV Alert" in your phone. Saving the number as a contact may also help prevent spam-blocking software from blocking the call.

Cell phone users may receive a text and/or call. Landline users should receive calls on their landline.

If you do not receive the alert or experience an issue, please contact Information Services at ext. 7200 or submit a work order through Uniguest.

Who Gets My Stuff?

Most people think that joint ownership means that if one of the partners dies, the other one gets everything. However, joint ownership without a will can result in unnecessary estate taxes and gift taxes. A well-written will can save a lot of expense when an estate is being settled. In addition, the state will generally divide any portion of the estate that is not jointly titled between the spouse and any children who survive. In the case of dependent children, state law may place such property in a trust for the children, possibly requiring the surviving spouse to go to court to get permission to spend the funds if the need arises.
