Lifespring Construction Update

I am happy to announce that the construction of Lifespring has begun! The site contractor, York Excavating, started placing erosion and stormwater controls on the site this past week. House demolition, grading, and utility work will continue for the next 6 weeks. The general contractor, R.S. Mowery & Sons, is expected to start building construction in mid-May. Building completion is scheduled for the fall of 2024.

This will be a fast-paced, exciting project for Cross Keys Village. The area will be a flurry of activity. It is okay to observe the work from a distance. For your safety, do not enter the construction site. Even if it looks like no work is taking place, safety hazards are still present. Your safety is important to us!

Psalms to Start Your Day

- 1) Take delight in the Lord, and he shall give you your heart's desire. (Psalm 37:4) We are to "take delight" in the Lord. Like savoring blueberries that are good for the heart, so is our delight in God.
- 2) Create in me a clean heart, O God, and renew a right spirit within me. (Psalm 51:11) Some days we feel weary and down. A verse like this reminds us of where to put our hope and trust, to renew our spirit.
- 3) For God alone my soul in silence waits; truly, my hope is in him. (Psalm 62:6) Waiting in silence is a way to praise. Paying attention to the noisy mind is to be able to let go of the noisy mind and put hope in the right place.
- 4) Remember, Lord, how short life is, how frail you have made all flesh. (Psalm 89:47) I do not think of myself as old, but I am old enough for Medicare and Social Security, heading towards the last years of life. This Psalm reminds us not to ignore the aches that can come with age. Knowing how short life is reminds us to honor the preciousness of each day.
- 5) For the Lord is good; his mercy is everlasting; and his faithfulness endures from age to age. (Psalm 100:4) Mercy. What a great word. How rare it appears in our everyday life. And faithfulness. Those virtues of God are the long-lasting ones, to hold onto in the busyness of our days.
- 6) I lift up my eyes to the hills; from where is my help to come? My help comes from the Lord... (Psalm 12:1-2) Look to nature. Look to the view outside your window. Go for a walk. See the sky, the clouds coming and going. We all have these views. Use them as opportunities to praise the Lord.

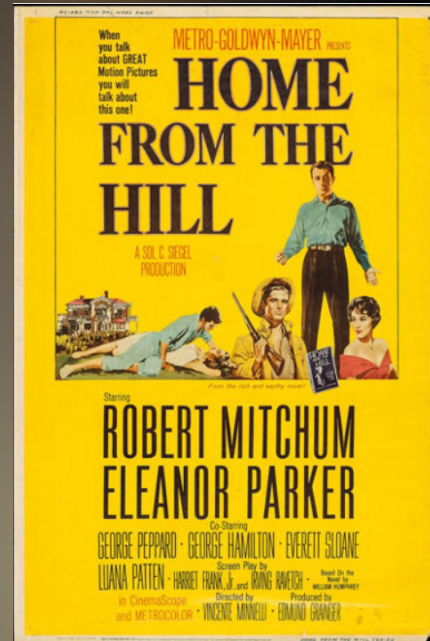

Home from the Hill is a 1960 melodrama starring Robert Mitchum, Eleanor Parker, Everett Sloane, and Luana Patten. Directed by Vincente Minnelli, the screenplay is adapted from the 1958 novel of the same name by William Humphrey. The title is from the last line of Robert Louis Stevenson's short poem "Requiem".

Early in their careers, George Peppard and George Hamilton star prominently.

Wade Hunnicutt (Mitchum), a notorious womanizer and the wealthiest and most powerful person in his East Texas town, is wounded by a jealous husband. Wade's scornful but beautiful wife Hannah (Parker) raised their son Theron (Hamilton) to be dependent upon her, but as he reaches adulthood, his father seeks help for Theron to become a man. Wade has his loyal employee Rafe (Peppard) introduce Theron to hunting and other masculine pursuits. Theron admires the slightly older self-reliant Rafe, and rapidly develops into a marksman and skilled hunter.

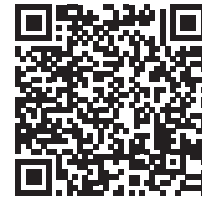
