Village Spring Clean Up

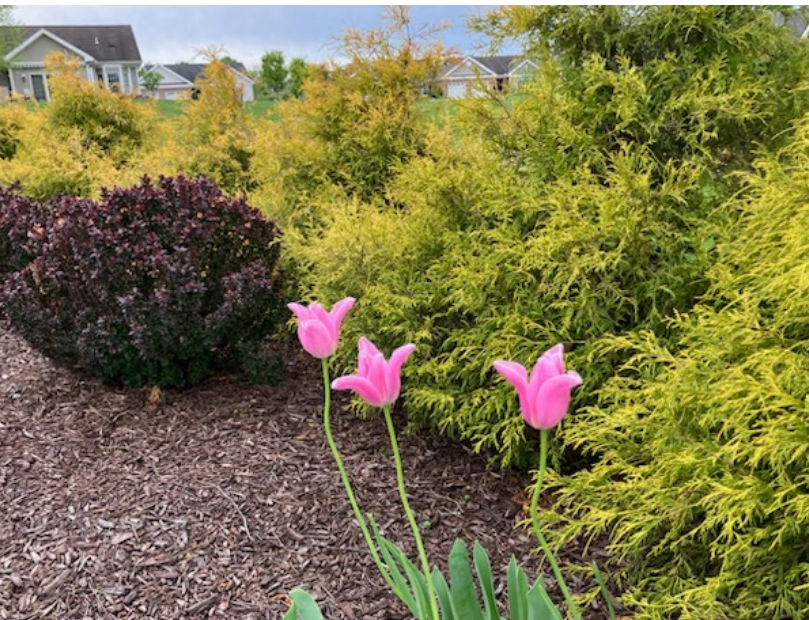
