Memorial Day CKV Military Veterans Committee

Monday, May 25, is Memorial Day. The CKV Veterans Committee has placed a display in the Harmony Ridge lobby to honor all those who gave their lives in defense of the nation.

Memorial Day is a national holiday set aside to honor the country's military members who died in service. It dates to the Civil War but at that time was known as "Decoration Day" because of the tradition of decorating soldiers' graves with flowers and flags. It was extended to include fallen soldiers from all American wars. In 1971, Congress declared it a national holiday, changing the observance from May 30 to the last Monday in May.

Currently there are about 130 military veterans living at Cross Keys Village. Thank you for being willing to risk all in defense of the United States of America.
